**KLUGER, PERETZ, KAPLAN & BERLIN, P.L.'S EX-PARTE
MOTION TO CONTINUE POST-CONFIRMATION STATUS CONFERENCE
SCHEDULED FOR MONDAY AUGUST 6, 2007 AT 2:00 P.M.**

Kluger, Peretz, Kaplan & Berlin, P.L. ("KPKB"), pursuant to Local Rule 9013-1(C)(1), moves the Court on an *ex parte* basis for the entry of an order continuing the post-confirmation status conference currently scheduled for Monday, August 6, 2007 at 2:00 p.m. (the "Motion"), and in support thereof, states as follows:

1. On November 29, 2004, an involuntary petition under Chapter 11 was filed against the Debtor. Thereafter, on May 16, 2005, the Court entered an order for relief under Chapter 11.
2. On March 12, 2007, the Court conducted a hearing to consider confirmation of the First Amended Joint Plan of Reorganization of Debtor and American Capital Holdings, Inc., as modified, Pursuant to 11 U.S.C. § 1129 (the "Confirmation Hearing").
3. Following conclusion of the Confirmation Hearing, this Court entered the Order Confirming First Amended Joint Plan of Reorganization of Debtor and American Capital Holdings, Inc., as modified, Pursuant to 11 U.S.C. § 1129 on March 23, 2007 (the "Confirmation Order")(C.P.# 295).

4. Pursuant to the Confirmation Order, the Court originally scheduled a post-confirmation status conference for May 9, 2007 which was later re-noticed by the Court to May 14, 2007, and ultimately continued to August 6, 2007 at 2:00 p.m. (the "Post-Confirmation Status Conference"). *See* Order Continuing Post-Confirmation Status Conference (C.P. # 316).

5. The Court reserved jurisdiction to entertain any supplemental requests for award of fees and reimbursement of expenses by KPKB, as well as any requests for award of fees and reimbursement of expenses by Wieseneck, Andres & Company, P.A. ("Wieseneck") as Auditors for the Debtor.

6. KPKB is currently in the process of assisting Wieseneck in preparing the Wieseneck Application.

7. The Post-Confirmation Status Conference is currently scheduled for August 6, 2007.

8. KPKB is requesting a brief continuance of the Post confirmation Status Conference to August 20, 2007, in order to (i) allow KPKB sufficient time to finalize the filing of the Wieseneck Application; and (ii) provide the Court and interested parties additional time to review the Wieseneck Application.

9. Additionally, undersigned counsel is presently scheduled to travel to New York on August 6, 2007 for meetings in an unrelated case and is, therefore, unable to attend the Post-Confirmation Status Conference.

10. This request is not being made for the purpose of delay, but in the interest of justice and efficiency. No party will be prejudiced and no harm or injury will occur by the continuance and extension requested herein.
